Holiday Blessings to each of you. I am writing to inform you of several changes in our organization that will impact all our membership. Due to financial considerations, we have had to lay off our Headquarters staff in Fort Worth and we have changed to a less expensive bookkeeping service. This will go into effect with the last staff day December 15, 2023. From December 16, 2023 until January 2, 2024, the office will be closed for the Holidays in keeping with a similar schedule observed by National Garden Clubs.

From January 2 forward, some of the office duties will be redistributed to some of our Executive officers and to chairmen. However, we would like to have volunteer staff in the office at least a few days a week to answer the phone, open mail and do some light housekeeping. This will allow our organization to transition through a difficult financial period.

Also, because of these changes, we would like to be able to reduce some of our costs for exterior maintenance – especially in the wildscape area and around the building and in the flower beds. The Board of Directors discussed the possibility of leasing the Headquarters building at the Fall Board Meeting, and a committee was formed to pursue this option which will be voted on by membership before this becomes a reality.

I am grateful for the commitment of the wonderful men and women of Texas Garden Clubs and believe that we will emerge from this transition as a stronger and more financially secure organization.

DISTRICT III PROPOSED BY-LAW AMENDMENT

SECTION 1: GENERAL

- a. GENERAL FUNDS: Membership dues, Garden Therapy assessment, proceeds from "Ways and Means," projects, interest from Life Membership Fund, and other general income received shall be deposited in this fund and be expended for budgeted and operating expenses of the District by direction of the Director and Treasurer.
- b. WAYS AND MEANS FUND: Proceeds from "Ways and Means," projects may will be deposited in a temporary account of the Chairman's choice, to be transferred to the General Funds, as needed, or at the close of an administration. The Ways and Means Chairman will prepare a complete report for the Board and General Assembly at each meeting.
- c. DISTRICT III NEWSLETTER FUND: All monies received from subscriptions may be deposited in a temporary account and disbursed by the Newsletter Editor with the direction of the Director. A complete report of receipts and disbursements will be prepared to be presented to the Board and General Assembly at each meeting.


SECTION 2: RESTRICTED

a. WELMA AKIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Donations and bequests, designated for Scholarships will be maintained in this fund. Only the interest on this fund shall be used for awarding scholarships each year. The Scholarship Chairman and the Director Treasurer shall dispense these funds as directed by the committee and be approved by the membership. The Scholarship Chairman will be responsible for maintaining the records of the fund and shall present a report to the Board and General Assembly each year which reflects the permanent portion and interest available for distribution.
